Commuter Express

The Maple Grove Transit System provides commuter express service to and from downtown Minneapolis Monday through Friday. Our buses are white with a "maple leaf" logo. There are five express routes: 780, 781, 782, 783, and 785. The Route 788 shuttle acts as a collector and transfers customers to the Route 783. Route 787 is a flex route that offers an off-peak ride to the other park-and-ride lots from the Transit Station. Route 789 provides service to the University of Minnesota.

Dial-a-Ride

The Dial-a-Ride program is an advance reservation, shared-ride, curb-to-curb van service available to the general public.

Rider Reservation Number: 763-493-2200

Service Hours: Monday - Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

No service on Sundays or Holidays (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas).

Service Area: Within City of Maple Grove boundaries, plus service to City of Osseo, Hennepin Technical College/North Hennepin Community College and Starlight Transit Station (next to Cub Foods in Brooklyn Park)

Fares: \$1.75 cash per one way ride (exact change, no checks)

- ▶ Children 5 years old and younger ride free
- ▶ You can also purchase ten ride punch cards for \$15.00 (you save \$2.50) at the Government Center, Community Center and Cub Foods.

Child Safety Restraints Seats: The proper use and installation of the Child Safety Restraint Seat is fully the responsibility of the accompanying adult. A ride will not be provided for anyone violating the following elements of this policy:

- ▶ Children under age 8 and shorter than 4 feet 9 inches tall must be secured in a safety seat or booster seat that meets federal safety standards
- ▶ Children cannot ride in a seat belt alone until they are age 8 or 4 feet 9 inches tall — whichever comes first
- ▶ Safety seats must be installed and used according to the manufacturer's instructions

Transit Link

This program is an initiative of the Metropolitan Council. The service area includes all communities within Hennepin County. However, to ensure Transit Link service does not duplicate regular route service, each trip request will be evaluated for eligibility. To be eligible for Transit Link, the trip must not be possible by regular route transit.

Metro Mobility

The Metropolitan Council operates the Metro Mobility program, which is a bus service available to persons with disabilities. You must first be registered with Metro Mobility before you are eligible to use the service. The registration process includes a medical doctor's certification of the disability.

There are no restrictions on the trip's purpose or destination within the service area and service times. The service area and service times do vary throughout the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. The service cannot be used for emergency medical purposes.

Metro Transit

Metro Transit is one of the country's largest transit systems, providing roughly 95 percent of the 73 million bus trips taken annually in the Twin Cities. Each weekday customers board Metro Transit buses an average of 231,000 times.

Metro Transit operates 137 routes — 70 are local-service routes, 51 are express routes, and 16 contract service routes using a fleet of 913 buses. The majority of the company's fleet (790) are standard 40-foot buses while 115 are articulated ("accordion") buses, with 16 small buses, and two coach buses. All Metro Transit buses are equipped with wheelchair lifts or ramps.

Metro Transit also provides car and vanpooling services.
