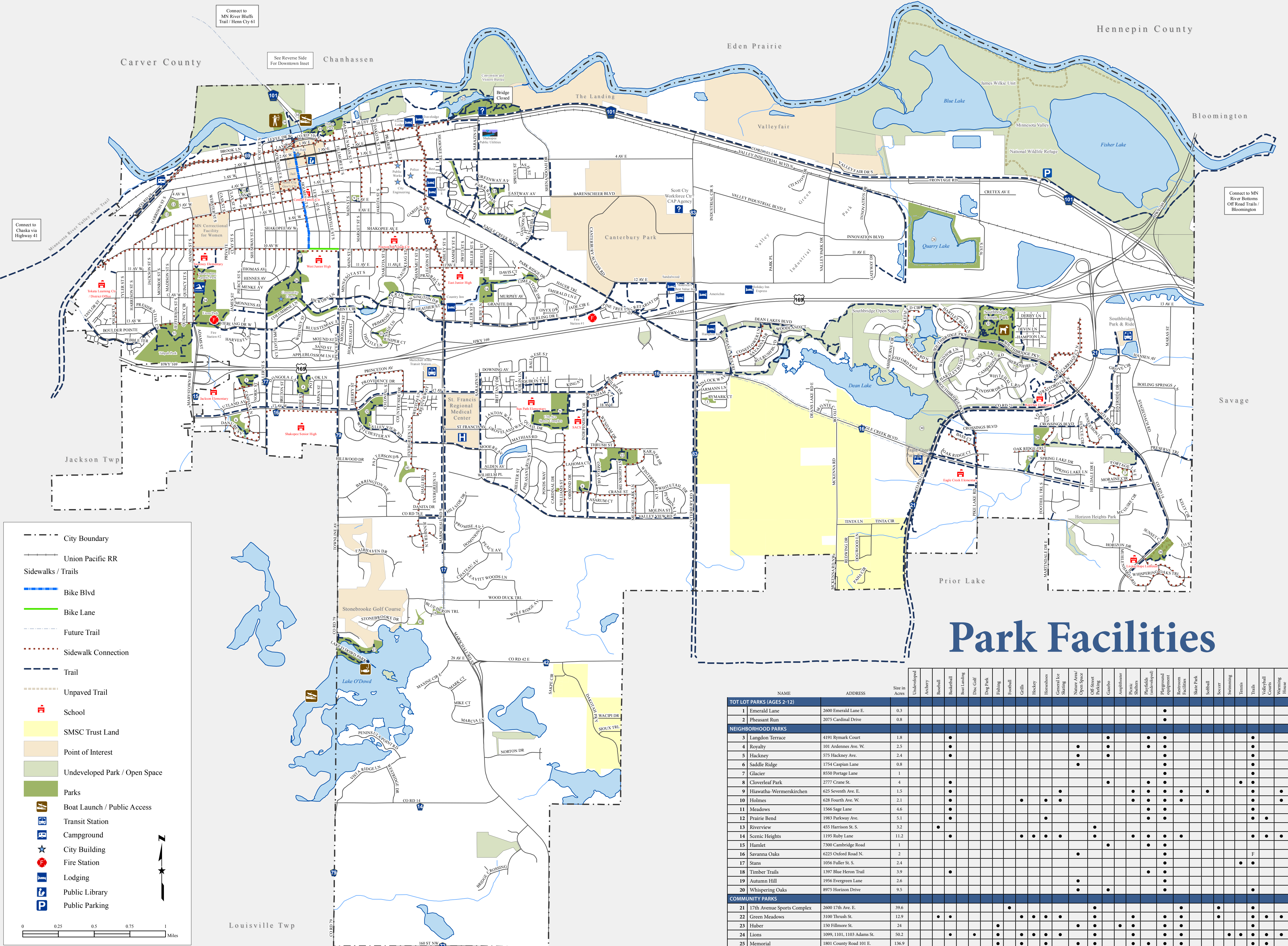

Trails

MINNESOTA VALLEY STATE TRAIL

Owned and operated by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, the multi-use Minnesota Valley State Trail parallels the Minnesota River from Belle Plaine to the Bloomington Ferry trailhead in Bloomington. It runs along the northern border of Shakopee, just north of County Road 101.

The 10-mile section of trail from Chaska to Bloomington is paved and a popular biking distance. Portions of the trail are part of the Minnesota Valley State Recreation Area. It is a designated snowmobile trail.

Parking & Access to the Trail

- Trail Site #2: East of Minnesota Highway 41, 1 mile south of Chaska

- Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge Wilkie Unit: Intersection of County Road 101 E. and Stagecoach Road



DEAN LAKE TRAIL



The Dean Lake Trail is a scenic trail that connects the Dean Lakes area to the Southbridge area. The trail includes a loop that contains boardwalks over wetlands.

Access to the Trail

QUARRY LAKE TRAIL

Funded in part by a grant from the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community, this newly constructed trail connects Quarry Lake Park to 12th Avenue in the Valley Green Industrial Park. The half-mile trail follows a scenic drainage way and ends at Quarry Lake Park, which is set to open in 2016. From the park, patrons can continue on along Innovation Drive and Valley Park Drive to the Minnesota Valley State Trail north of County Road 101.



LAKE O'DOWD TRAIL



The nature trail at Lake O'Dowd Park has scenic views, particularly in fall overlooking the lake. The park also features a fishing pier.

SCENIC HEIGHTS TO TAHPAH PARK DRAINAGE WAY TRAIL

This 3-mile, paved trail cuts through the heart of Shakopee, running east to west from Scenic Heights Park to Tahpah Park. It runs near the Shakopee Community Center entrance and follows the Minnesota Valley Drainage Channel.

The mostly sunny path runs through several parks and behind the Shakopee Community Center.

Lions Park

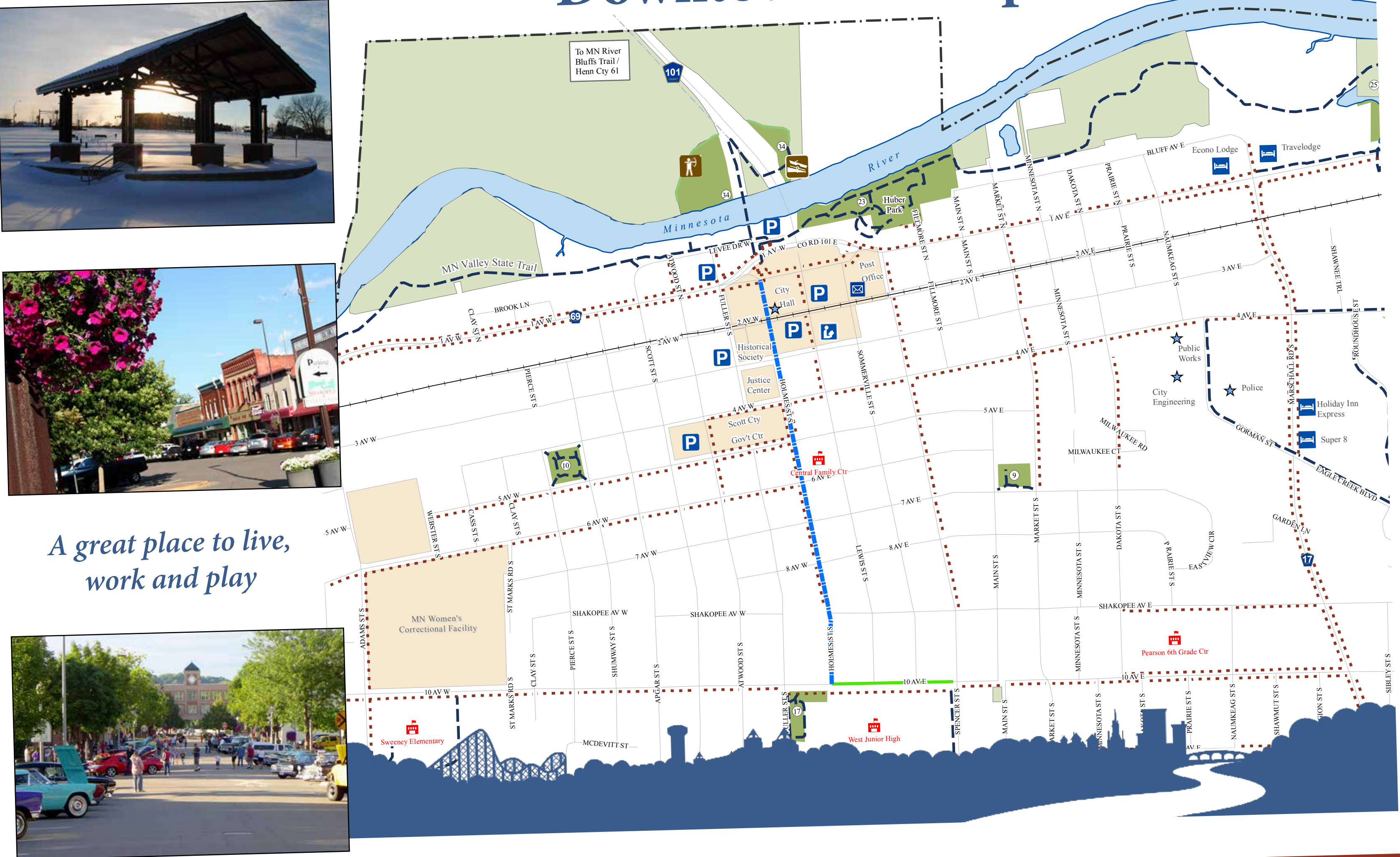
Home to SandVenture Aquatic Park and an 18-hole Disc Golf Course, this park is a favorite for company picnics, family reunions and community events. The 50-acre park has a basketball court, playground, tennis courts, hockey rink and pleasure skating area. The park is also home to the Youth Building, an insulated log cabin available for rent year-round.



Southbridge Community Park

This new park, which opened in fall 2014, includes an off-leash dog park, trails, a hockey rink, a shelter/warming house (planned for 2015) and parking area. A City of Shakopee dog license is required for use of the off-leash dog area. Licenses can be purchased at the Community Center and online.

Memorial Park

With access to the Minnesota Valley State Trail, Veterans Memorial Park is a central hub. The park is home to several historic sites, such as the Mill Pond, 2,000-year-old Native American burial mounds and Shakopee's veterans memorial monument. The Shakopee Visitors and Convention Bureau is also located in the park.



17th Avenue Sports Complex

17th Avenue Sports Complex

The 17th Avenue Sports Complex hosts soccer, football and other turf sports throughout the spring, summer and fall months. The Sports Complex includes approximately 40 acres of athletic fields.

Nestled along the Minnesota River in downtown Shakopee, Huber Park was finished just in time for Shakopee's sesquicentennial in 2007. It is home to several community events, including the Huber Park Performance & Events Series and Shakopee Derby Days. The park has trails, an amphitheater stage, picnic shelter and a large, community-built playground.

Home of the City's largest ball-field complex, as well as Joe Schleper Baseball Stadium, Tahpah Park has a large playground, eight softball fields and one football field. The outfields of the softball diamonds are also used for football in the fall.
